Methodology

These findings are from a proprietary survey conducted by HIT Strategies on behalf of Horizon Foundation. This survey consisted of 400 POC Howard County residents, and 200 POC Baltimore County and Anne Arundel County residents making under \$85,000 a year. The survey was conducted via phone, text to web, and online and fielded from April 18 to May 15, 2023. The margin of error is +/- 4.0% (total), +/- 4.9% (Howard County), and higher in subgroups.

Key Findings

Most respondents reported their biggest challenges are related to housing, transportation, and jobs.

For people of color in Howard County making under \$85k, housing (19% selected) stood out as the biggest challenge, followed by transportation (12%) and job availability, quality, and wages (11%). When it comes to housing, we found that 17% of low-income people of color in Howard County are worried about losing their current housing and 5% do not have a steady place to live. Problems like pests/bugs (28%) and mold/leaks (16%) in homes were also reported.

Latinx, younger Howard Countians, those without a Bachelor's degree, and caretakers report experiencing each challenge at higher rates.

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Generally, there was agreement across audiences about the most prevalent challenges, but different demographics report experiencing these challenges at varying rates. For example, while 27% of total survey population reported skipping meals due to lack of money, 43% of non-college educated respondents, 42% of Latinx, 33% of Under 50 and 33% of caretakers respondents reported this.

When it comes to affordability, primary pain points are housing, utilities, and food costs.

Rent/mortgage, food, and utilities costs were the top financial pain points for those who had skipped or delayed bill payments (47% selected each), further emphasizing the prioritization of these issues when it comes to improving the everyday lives of Howard County residents. Additionally, over a quarter of respondents report having trouble accessing healthy food (26%) or having skipped meals due to lack of money for food (27%). About a quarter (24%) of respondents also reported their primary challenge with their job is that it doesn't pay enough.

There are nuances between demographics when it comes to the barriers causing pain points.

For example, when it comes to health care, Latinx audience differs in that their top pain points are affordability (22% selected) and their job not offering health insurance (21%), while for AAPI respondents the top barrier has to do with appointment convenience and availability (22%). Respondents over 50 (46%) and caretakers (53%) report medical costs as a top financial burden, while college-educated respondents report loans/debt (49%), but these factors were not as salient among other audiences.

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Younger, Latinx, and Non-college respondents reporting challenges at higher rates

Use various outreach methods to target these audiences with communications about accessing programs (e.g. Online and social media outreach, in Spanish, through local businesses).

Housing reported as top challenge



Support policies and initiatives that address top pain points: rent/mortgage payments, utilities costs, and pest control.

Transportation challenges, especially among AAPI, Latinx and Under 50 respondents

Improvements should be focused on connecting residential areas, especially those concentrated with AAPI, Latinx and younger population, to supermarkets and medical centers.

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Over a quarter of respondents report food access is a challenge



Initiatives should prioritize the accessibility of healthy food according to the top reported barriers: making healthy food more affordable, and making transportation to healthy food options more convenient.

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21% of respondents needed mental health care, but did not receive it



Improve accessibility to mental health resources not only by making them more affordable, but also by working to relinquish the stigma around mental health treatment in the community.



Nuances between demographics when it comes to barriers



Encourage solutions that address barriers on a systemic level. Allow Howard Countians to tailor provisions to their unique needs.
