



BACKGROUND

- Almost 100 residents were interviewed through individual one on one conversations and focus groups.
- No identification information was collected but through observation I can deduct that:
- > 100% of participants are latinos, immigrants and first generation
- > 70% of those interviewed were women and 30% men
- ➤ 10% of participants were under 25 years old (latest census data shows that latinos in MD between ages of 18 and 24 years old are 15% of the total population)
- > 55% of participants where between the ages of 26 and 50
- > 35% of participants where 50+ (latest <u>census</u> data shows that latinos in MD between the ages of 25 and 64 years old represent 38% of the total population)


QUESTION # 2





HEALTH

- Top issues in health:
 - 1. No health insurance or access to health care
 - 2. Intersection of immigration status and access to care
 - 3. High cost of health care/affordability
 - 4. Specialty and chronic illness care
 - 5. Access to care in Spanish
 - 6. Quality of care
 - 7. Emergency care






MENTAL HEALTH & OTHERS

- Stress inability to work, not paid fairly
- > Anxiety not enough income
- Depression no insurance, no care, long wait lists
- Need for care in Spanish
- Youth suffering from loneliness, anxiety, depression, suicidal ideation.
- Inexistent care for undocumented individuals with special needs.



IMMIGRATION DEFINITIONS

- Undocumented All immigrants without a legal status:
 - Entered with out inspection -EWI
 - Entered with legal status but overstayed
 - Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals DACA
 - Currently in process of legalizing
 - Vulnerable Immigrants limbo (TPS, U-visa)
 - Mix-status families US Citizens, permanent residents, TPS, undocumented.



IMMIGRATION

- Large percentage of undocumented residents:
 - Work/career barriers:
 Difficulty finding/keeping jobs
 Employer abuse
 Lower wages
 - 2. Fear:

Deportation and family separation

To apply for resources

To call police

3. Housing:

Higher down payments and security deposits

More requirements for rentals and purchases

Higher interest rates

4. Health:


Not eligible for insurance


Only one sliding fee PCP in the county

IMMIGRATION

- > Smaller percentage with pending cases:
 - 1. Long waits and high costs of processes
 - 2. Inability to work while waiting
 - 3. Inability to travel while waiting
 - 4. Not eligible for insurance or other state/federal benefits while waiting
- Mixed status:
 - Not accessing resources for elegible members due to fear, public charge, and lack of information .
- Difficulty obtaining a driver's license across the board.
- Professional immigrants have difficulty validating their studies.







INFORMATION

- Majority of our Spanish speaking residents do not know where to find information about services and resources.
- Information is not available
 Spanish.
- Rely on friends and family for information, which leads to misinformation.

EDUCATION - HCPSS

- Lack of support in Spanish within HCPSS.
- Many expressed concern around safety in schools: - Daily fights, drugs, gangs, arms in school buildings.
- No support with homework.
- Anxiety due to high performance pressure.
- Difficulty understanding and implementing IEPs.
- Discrimination, isolation, bullying against latino students.
- Need for transitional programs for graduating
 HS students with special needs.
- Need for higher ed information on registration and payment options.






EDUCATION - ADULTS

- Need for English classes, barriers:
 - 1. Cost of classes
 - 2. No time to study
 - 3. No transportation to go to classes
 - 4. Need for childcare to attend classes
- Small segment of the community is illiterate.
- Need for vocational training in Spanish for youth and adults.
- Need for classes in Spanish: financial literacy, parenting, entrepreneurship programs, programs for women, first aid, CPR, internet and basic technology.

CHILDCARE

- High childcare costs impedes access to day care and affects all aspects of life.
- Families rely on relatives and neighbors to watch their kids.
- No information on affordable pre-school programs.



"If Latinos living in the United States were an independent country, the U.S. Latino GDP would be tied with France for the seventh-largest GDP in the world".

Latino Impact in the U.S. Economy

- ➤ Latinos account for over 18.5% of the total U.S population (2020 Census)
- > Largest racial/ethnic minority in the nation.
- > 68.3% of Latinos are in the workforce (63.6% all Americans).
- ➤ High latino presence in key industries like agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting, construction, and administrative support.
- > There's approximately 5 million Latino Owned Businesses in the U.S.
- Latino households earned more than \$1.2 trillion, and payed \$308.5 billion in taxes

POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS

- > Changes in legislation regarding health and immigration.
- More funding to support programs catered to latinos and immigrants. (i.e. Columbia Community Care)
- Hiring program for undocumented individuals.
- > Different kind of lending for low income and undocumented individuals.
- Affordable health care program that includes primary care, specialty care, dental, vision, etc.
- Access to affordable health insurance.
